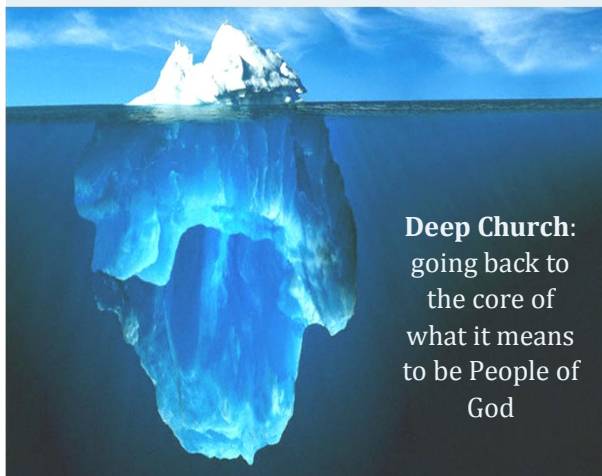

What is Deep Church?

Deep Church seeks to challenge the historical and spiritual *amnesia* of church and society in our modern era. We have forgotten who God is, who we are, and what our goal is — life in all its fullness in Christ.

Deep Church is about ‘AN-*amnesia*’ — the opposite of, and reversal of, *amnesia*. It’s a way of bringing our Christian past into the present so we can better understand our current place and our ultimate purpose in the ‘Big Picture’ — God’s timeless vision of past, present and future.

Deep Church helps us rediscover the vital relationship between on the one hand the historical traditions of the past, through which we have received our Scriptures, doctrines, liturgy and creeds, and on the other, the charismatic, Spirit-filled, Christ-lived reality of the present.

Deep Church reminds us that without the teachings of Jesus and the Apostolic tradition our faith has no firm foundation so that we lose our sense of trajectory and purpose. Equally, without the present in-dwelling of the Holy Spirit in our daily lives this historical tradition remains just a dry and dusty museum piece. The continuing collaboration of Spirit and Tradition are the foundation-stones of Deep Church.
